All parents/carers of reception children are invited to complete a health survey which includes useful information about child health and where you can get help and advise to meet your child's health needs during this next step in their journey.



As part of Kingston Council, Kingston Adult Education provides a range of courses to people aged 19 or over. A lot of their courses are free, and take place in school hours.
