Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) Inspection of Malden Parochial Church of England Primary School

Dear Parents and Carers,

All Church of England and Methodist schools are inspected approximately every five years by a SIAMS inspector from the Church of England. I will be inspecting your child's school on 7.10.25.

A SIAMS inspection is an opportunity to highlight the impact that the school's Christian vision has on the flourishing of the whole school community. As part of my evidence-gathering I will speak with a range of people, and it is likely that I will speak with some of you as part of those discussions.

Following the inspection, I will write a report. Once the report has been finalised it will be published, and the inspection findings will be shared with you. This will be approximately three weeks after the inspection. The report will celebrate all that is special about the school and will identify next steps that are helpful in the school's ongoing development as a Church school.

The report will be published on the school's website, as well as on the SIAMS website, and I would encourage you to read it.

I look forward to spending time with the school community.

School Fund

Supporting MPS School Fund is crucial for maintaining and improving our school's environment!

As a voluntary aided Church of England school, the upkeep and development of our buildings are managed through a funding structure with the Diocese of Southwark and its SDBE Development & Maintenance scheme. Think of this scheme as an insurance policy: our small annual contribution allows us to access a much larger pool of funding for major projects.

To meet our obligations and continue supporting vital improvements, we ask that parents and carers contribute a recommended amount of £60 to £120 per child per year to the MPS School Fund. This is the equivalent of just £5 to £10 per month and can be paid monthly or annually.

Your contributions make a real difference! Over the past few years, the Governors' school fund has directly invested nearly £40,000 back into the fabric of the school. This is *in addition* to our mandatory contribution to the SDBE scheme, which has secured significant funds for major works like:

- A new school roof
- Creation of an Art, Design and Technology classroom
- A major project to improve the school's waterworks
- Electrical remediation works
- Redecoration, lighting, and audio equipment for the school hall
- A contribution towards increasing energy bills
