What is happening in schools these days?
The New Ofsted Framework

We will receive a report card on 8 areas using a five-point scale not a one word judgement e.g. outstanding or good.

- **Exceptional** Evidence of sustained practice that has transformed outcomes and experiences for disadvantaged children.
- **Strong standard** Evidence of consistent, embedded and impactful practice.
- **Expected standard** Evidence of following statutory, professional, and non-statutory guidance.
- **Needs attention** when the expected standard for a given evaluation area is not achieved due to weaknesses or inconsistencies in practice.
- **Urgent improvement** Graded in the most serious cases when Ofsted evaluates an area to be failing overall or failing a significant group of pupils.

Ofsted will inspect

1. Inclusion

How well the school supports pupils with additional needs.

How pupils have access to learning, adaptations, and progress for all learners.

2. Curriculum and Teaching

How well the curriculum is planned, taught, and adapted for all pupils

Focuses on how well pupils learn over time.

3. Attendance and Behaviour

Inspect pupils' behaviour, attitudes, respect, and conduct around school.

How well does the school support children to get to school every day and on time and whether children are taken out of school during term time?

4. Achievement

What do pupils know and understand?

How well are children supported to read, handwrite, calculate?

5. Personal Development and Wellbeing

How does the school support children's wellbeing and provide wider opportunities?

Are pupils prepared for life through clubs, trips and online safety.

6. Early Years

Leaders ensure that the curriculum is well taught and that staff engage in high-quality interactions with children

Teaching identifies gaps in children's knowledge, and these are tackled

7. Leadership and Governance

How well leaders run the school, support staff, and keep children safe.

Includes workload, culture, safeguarding, and how leaders respond to concerns.

8. Safeguarding

Requirements are met from 'Keeping children safe in education' and 'Working together to safeguard children'. Safeguarding is 'met'.

There is strategic oversight of all aspects of safeguarding and promoting the welfare of pupils.



Our school setting is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse.

As a school setting we have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the children in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

On 24 May 2024 Royal Assent was granted to The Victims and Prisoners Act. The Act placed Operation Encompass into Law.

This places a statutory obligation on police forces to share Operation Encompass notifications with schools/educational settings.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and through Operation Encompass we will be able to provide the best possible support to our children.
